No entry is possible on Lambert Road.

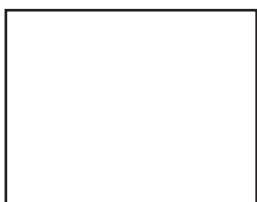

# CESQG Hazardous Waste Collection Event

## Is your business a conditionally exempt small quantity generator?

Conditionally Exempt Small Quantity Generators (CESQG) are businesses that generate a maximum of 220 pounds of hazardous waste in a calendar month. For more details about CESQG requirements, please visit [www.epa.gov](http://www.epa.gov).

## CESQGs must also have an EPA ID number.

If your business does not already have one, you can apply online through the Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) website at [www.dtsc.ca.gov/apply-for-hazardous-waste-epa-id-number/](http://www.dtsc.ca.gov/apply-for-hazardous-waste-epa-id-number/).

## What is hazardous waste?

Hazardous waste (HHW) is any type of product that requires special handling under environmental law and prohibits disposal as regular waste (trash).



## PREPARATION

- It is illegal to transport more than 15 gallons or 125 pounds of hazardous waste in your vehicle (Department of Transportation requirement).
- Do not mix products together.
- Materials should be in original containers, clearly labeled.
- All containers must have lids, be sturdy, non-leaking, labeled and protected from breakage.
- Containers larger than 5 gallons will not be accepted.

## DOCUMENT SHREDDING

Help prevent identity theft and protect the environment by shredding your confidential documents.

There is a limit of 10 boxes per car. Shredding is available during the hazardous waste collection event. Keep shredding separate from hazardous waste and batteries.

## ACCEPTABLE ITEMS:

### Hazardous Waste:

- Paint and painting supplies: latex, oil based, thinners, strippers, stains, and finishes
- Automotive products- oil, antifreeze, brake and transmission fluid, automotive batteries
- Cleaning products- drain cleaner, oven cleaner, bathroom cleaners
- Pesticides, herbicides- bug sprays, mouse and rat poison/bait, repellents
- Propane tanks
- Aerosol cans

### Universal and other special waste:

- Electronics – TV's, Computer monitors, laptops, stereo, DVD players, handheld electronics, cell phones, cameras, printers, scanners, fax
- Batteries (AAA, AA, C, D, 9-volt)
- Fluorescent tubes and bulbs (package to prevent breakage in transport)
- Thermostats, thermometers

### NON-ACCEPTABLE ITEMS:

- Asbestos
- Biological Waste
- High pressure cylinders
- Explosives, ammunition, road flares
- Medical Waste
- Sharps, needles, syringes
- White Goods (stoves, oven, water heater, refrigerators, air conditioners)
- General waste, bulky items (trash, recycling furniture, mattresses)
